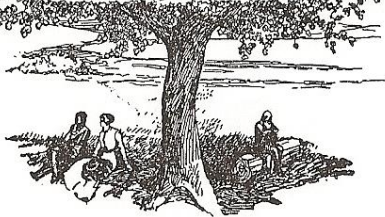

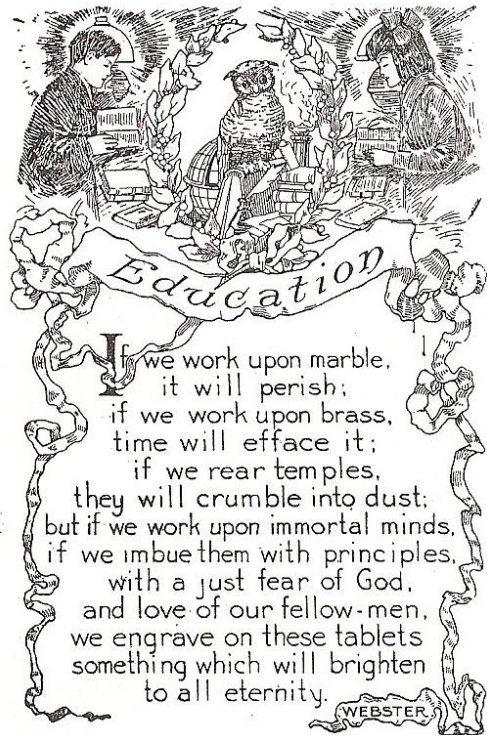


Life is what we make it
